In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires -- Interpretation

"berth" means a section of wharf, pier, jetty or quay or other fixed mooring facility at which a vessel can be moored. (In Freetown the berths on Queen Elizabeth II quay are given nominal numbers 1 to 6);

"commencement of time" means the period between 2400 hours on the day of receipt of export cargo and 2400 hours on the day of departure of the carrying vessel from the berth or port, in the case of imported cargo:

"free storage time" means the specified period of time during which cargo or cargo containers may remain on port property, subsequent to receipt by the port, free of any storage charges;

"freight container" means an item of transport equipment, not being a vehicle or conventional packing with the following characteristics—

- (a) permanent character and accordingly strong enough to be suitable for repeated use:
- (b) specifically designed to facilitate the carriage of goods by one or more modes of transport without intermediate reloading:
- (c) fitted with devices permitting its ready handling, particularly its transfer from one mode of transport to another, and
- (d) having an internal volume of 10 m or more:

"heavy lift" includes all single packages or items with a gross weight of more than five metric tonnes, but excluding ISO containers and vehicles which are accounted for under separate headings:

"hazardous cargo" includes all substances, liquids solids and gases which are either explosive, flammable, oxidizing, radioactive, toxic or infectious or which has shown or may show, to be of a dangerous character in accordance with the IMDG Code of 1977 and its supplements and amendments;

"jumbo bags" means specially designed bags with a capacity of more than one metric tonne, for the handling of bulk cargoes;

"transhipment cargo" means cargo which enters the Port of Freetown on one vessel and is intended, and fully documented as such, to leave Freetown for a second port, either on a second or subsequent vessel or on the same vessel during a different section of her voyage;

Provision of special services.

Where services of a special nature are requested by any person and there is no provision for such services in these Regulations. the Authority may render such services at a rate agreed between it and that person; and such rate may include the cost of labour.

Transhipment cargo.

No transhipment cargo shall leave any port premises except by sea carriage.

Marine charges.

- 7. (1) The charges set out in the First Schedule shall be payable, in respect of the relevant services, by the owner, master, operator or agent of the vessel for which the services are rendered.
- The charges shall be calculated on the length overall of the wessel in meters as contained in her certificate of registration, calculated to the nearest whole meter.
- The following vessels, are exempted from the payment of the charges set out in the First Schedule
  - vessels belonging to the Government (11) not engaged in trade:

# MARINE SERVICES (REGULATION 8)

#### Commencement of time in port for marine charges

The 24 hour all inclusive period will be calculated to commence from 2400 hours local time on the day of arrival and all days after that period will be calculated from 0001 to 2400 hours.

#### 2. The Inclusive Rate

The standard charge includes all charges for entry to the port, at anchorage or alongside a benth, a stay of up to 24 hours from 2400 hours on the day of arrival and final departure. It also includes *inter alia:*—

- (a) the service of licensed or authorized pilots:
- (b) the services of one port tug for berthing or unberthing:
- (c) charges for berthing and unberthing, double banking and special mooring arrangements:
- (d) the use of mooring gangs and a mooring launch while berthing and unberthing:
- (e) quay dues;

- (f) light dues:
- (g) buoyage and maintenance charges;
- (h) dredging and maintenance charges:
- (i) the collection and disposal of up to one cubic meter of galley and normal garbage per day;
- (j) the presence of Port Security on board vessels, one gangway watchman:
- (k) berth alongside, or anchorage, for up to 24 hours.

### 3. Vessels using anchorage

The standard charge for vessels coming to an anchorage or mooring and not berthing alongside any pier or wharf is US\$10.00 per meter of length.

4. Vessels over 100 meters in length using piers or alongside berths

The standard charge for vessels over 100 meters in length using any pier or alongside berth is US\$55.00 per meter of length.

This fee also includes any temporary stay at anchor, within the initial period of 24 hours, while awaiting a berth or final clearance on departure.

5. Vessels between 50 and 100 metres in length using piers or alongside herths

The standard charge for vessels between 50 and 100 meters in length using any pier or alongside berth is US\$300.00 per meter of length.

This fee includes any temporary stay at anchor, within the initial period of 24 hours, while awaiting a berth or final clearance on departure.

# Vessels between 20 to 50 meters in length

Vessels of more than 20 meters and less than 50 meters overall length may enter and leave Sierra Leone ports without a pilot or tugs for a standard charge of US\$4.00 per meter of overall length.

Vessels of this size calling frequently into Sierra Leone ports may be quoted ar all inclusive annual rate for marine charges on application to the Authority.

# Small, Craft less than 20 meters in length

Small local craft of less than 20 meters overall length may enter, stay and depart from Sierra Leone ports free of marine charges.

Foreign registered craft of less than 20 meters overall length may enter and leave Sierra Leone ports without pilotage and other marine charges, as above, on payment of a single charge of US\$50.00 which will allow a stay of one month.

# Vessels frequently calling at Sierra Leone Ports

Shipping lines operating liner services with vessels which call at Sierra Leone ports more than twelve times in a year (January 01 to December, 31) will be granted a reduction of marine charges of five per cent on all further calls made in that year. The reduction will be calculated and credited after the twelfth such call.

# Charges for stay of over 24 hours

All vessels charged under items 3, 4 and 5 which remain in Sierra Leone ports after the expiry of the 24 hour initial period will be charged on a daily basis of twenty-four hours or part thereof, at the following rates—

- (i) for vessels at anchorage USS2.00 per meter of length;
- (ii) for vessels alongside US\$10.00 per meter of length.

All vessels using specialised loading or discharging points will be charged for compulsory marine services US\$50.00 per meter of overall length for the duration of their stay.

# 11. Ordering of Pilots and Requests for Berths

On arrival at a Sierra Leone port, all vessels will be allocated a sequential number, which will normally be used to determine the order of berthing or service.

The allocation of alongside berths and the booking of pilots will normally be made at the daily berthing meeting Mondays to Fridays.

However the port pilot station is manned on a twenty-four hour basis and vessels or their agents may contact the station on VIIF channel 16 working frequency 12, to provide updated times of arrival or departure.

Final booking of a pilot has to be confirmed in writing giving at least three hours' notice.

# 12. Cancellation of a request for pilot

A request properly made for the services of a pilot may be cancelled or amended during office working hours—(Mondays to Fridays 0800 to 1700) free of any charge.

A cancellation made during non-office working hours, including Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays, will be subject to a cancellation charge of US\$100.00.

# 3. Detention of pilots and stand-by time

If a vessel is not ready to manoeuvre at the time that pilots and tugs are ordered and arrive on board, free stand-by time of one hour will be granted.

15.

For delays and stand-by time exceeding one hour, for any cause, a flat rate charge of US\$100.00 per hour or part thereof will be levied.

Vessels which request the services of a pilot, which involves a stay on board for a period in excess of six hours, will be charged a daily rate of USS200.00 in addition to the regular or standard marine charges.

Where pilots are required to stay on board for periods in excess of six hours, the ship will be responsible for the provision of feeding and accommodation.

#### Shifting berths

Vessels which are requested by Port Management to shift berth or to vacate berth for port's convenience, will be shifted free of all charges for pilots, tugs or mooring gangs.

Vessels which request a shift of borth, or request the Port Management to shift another vessel for their convenience, will be charged a flat fee of US\$500.00 for each vessel so shifted.

Requesting vessels will also be charged USS500.00 for the ever tual return of a shifted vessel from the anchorage to let berth:

Vessels which refuse to shift or vacate a berth, when properly ordered by Port Management by the giving of three hours' notice in writing, will be liable to a penalty charge of USS 100.00 for each hour, or part of an hour, of delay.

### Use of additional tugs

Where, due to special circumstances, more than one tug is considered necessary to manœuver a vessel, when berthing or unberthing, the charge for the additional tug will be US\$500.00 per hour, or part thereof, or the actual charter rate charged by the Authority, whichever is the greater.

Hire of tugs or marine craft for other purposes including lighterage

For towage, assisting or standing-by vessels or craft within the harbour-

vessels at the main quays, a standard charge of US\$500.00 per hour, or part thereof, is payable.

#### 17. Hire of launches

For the hire of a launch and its crew for operations or movements within the harbour limits an hourly charge of USS100.00 will be made. The time will commence from the time that the launch is allocated by the Harbour Department for the duty, until the launch and its crew are returned to their regular stand-by condition.

Where a launch is requested to proceed outside of harbour limits, the hourly charge will be doubled to USS200.00 per hour or part thereof.

## 18. Laying or maintenance of buoys and moorings

Where the Authority is requested to supply craft, equipment and personnel for the laying, recovery or maintenance of buoys, moorings or marine structures, a special all-inclusive contract price will be negotiated.

### 19. Double banking

Vessels double banking or berthing alongside other vessels will be considered to be either alongside or at anchor depending on the status of the first vessel.

## 20. Special mooring arrangements

Requests for special mooring arrangements, including Mediterranean moors, are charged within the standard marine charges.

#### 21. Harbour dues

Ships berthing alongside Queen Elizabeth II Quay or at Kissy Oil Jetty or other berth under the jurisdiction of the Authority for the purpose of dealing with cargo or passengers or any other services will pay harbour dues at the following rate:—

# STEVEDORING (CARGO) SERVICES (REGULATION 8)

#### Charges for Stevedoring Services

These charges are payable by the ship, or the consignee and include the use of one stevedore gang with all its equipment and support staff, as required by the stevedore, for one hour during the standard shift from (0800–1700) either loading or discharging. The standard charge includes all stand-by time, unlashing and preparation of holds or equipment, whether or not performed by the ship's crew or the stevedores.

Note:—The Authority is the sole stevedore, licensed and permitted to operate in the Port. All stevedoring and cargo handling services, whether performed by the Authority manpower or not, will be charged as if the services were rendered by the Authority's stevedore.

2. Standard stevedore rate per gang hour (General Cargo Operations)

The standard stevedore gang rate is USS30.00 per gang hour, and applies to all stevedoring services on cargoes listed in item 10, rendered between 0800 and 1700 hours Mondays to Fridays.

3. Overtime charges for stevedore labour

For stevedore gangs required to work between 1700 and 0800 hours the following day, Mondays to Fridays and at weekends and Public Holidays, the rate charged is USS40.00 per gang hour.

4. Hire of additional gangs for cleaning or other tasks

Additional gangs for sweeping, cleaning and other special tasks can be hired at the fixed rate of U\$\$35.00 per gang hour, subject to a minimum hire period of four hours.

Hire of one winchman ... US\$70.00 per 24 hours.

5. Stevedore labour for container operations

The stevedore labour charge for container operations is included within the specific charges as provided in item 12.

6. Composition of stevedoring gangs

The composition and the number of men involved in a stevedoring gang are at the sole discretion of the Authority and may be varied depending on the circumstances.

7. Ordering of stevedore labour

Stevedore gangs which are required to commence work at 0800 or 1300, Mondays to Saturdays, must be so ordered at the daily berthing meeting held on the previous day.

In the case of unforeseen circumstances, stevedore gangs for work commer cement after 1100 may be ordered not later than 0830 the same day and at 1500 or start at 0800 the following day.

Gangs required to work overtime hours, i.e., after 1700 Mondays to Fridays and Saturdays, Sundays, and Public Holidays must be so ordered at the regular berthing meeting during the previous working day.

The Authority may reject requests for the supply of stevedore labour which are made outside of these times.

### Stevedore standby and waiting time

Stevedoring gangs which are properly ordered for work on a vessel and are unable to start due to delays or other reasons are charged at the standby or waiting rate of US\$20.00 per gang hour for general cargo operations.

## Cancellation of stevedore labour

In the event of the non arrival or delay of a vessel, the Authority will accept requests for the cancellation of stevedore labour up to four hours prior to the expected commencement of work subject to a minimum standby charge, at US\$20.00 per hour, of two hours per gang so cancelled.

## Tonnage charges (Stevedoring) Non-Containerized cargo

Where a ship discharges cargo with mixed marks so that initial sorting is required at the hook, an additional charge of USS5.00 per tonne are levied on the tonnage charges listed in item 10.

#### 12. Stevedoring Charges for Containers (Import and Export)

This charge is calculated for all stevedoring activities, including the hire of stevedore gangs, unlashing, lifting, delivery to and from port or road transport, or direct loading to or from alternative transport.

1. Standard port labour rate, per gang/hour

The standard rate for Port cargo handling labour will be Le12,000 per gang hour.

### 2. Charges for port labour

This charge includes the use of one port cargo handling gang with all their equipment, checkers, tallymen and support staff, as required by the fraffic Manager, for one hour during the standard port operating period from 0800 to 1700 daily Mondays to Fridays.

### 3. Overtime charges for Port Jabour

For work between 1700 hours and 0800 hours the following day, Mondays to Fridays, and at weekends and on Public Holidays the standard gang rate will be increased to Le18,000 per gang hour.

# 4. Composition of Port Cargo handling Gangs

The composition and the number of men involved in a port cargo handling labour gang will be at the discretion of the Port Management and may be varied depending on circumstances.

#### 5. Ordering of Port labour

\* Port labour gangs which are required to commence work at 0800 or 1300, Mondays to Saturdays, must be so ordered at the berthing meeting held on the previous day.

In the case of unforeseen circumstances port labour gangs for covamencement after 1100 may be ordered not later than 0830 the same day and at 1500 for start at 0800 the following day. Such emergency ordering of labour will only be accepted at Port's convenience.

Gangs required to work overtime hours, i.e., after 1700 Mondays to Fridays and Saturdays, Sundays and Public Holidays must be so ordered at the regular benthing a seeting during the previous working day.

The Authority reserves the right to reject requests for the supply of port labour which are made outside of these times.

### 6. Standby and waiting time

Port labour gangs which are properly ordered for work on cargo being loaded or discharged from a vessel and which are unable to work due to delay or other reason will be charged at the standby or waiting rate of Le6,000 per gang hour.

### 7. Cancellation of Port labour gangs

In the event of the non arrival or delay of a vessel the Authority will accept requests for the cancellation of port labour subject to a minimum standby payment of two hours per gang so cancelled.

9. Non manifested goods shipped in vehicles

Vehicles which arrive in Sierra Leone ports containing personal effects, spare parts, household goods or any other items which do not form part of the vehicles' normal fittings and equipment will be charged Le 10.000 in addition to the normal charges as above.

10. Direct delivery and receipt of cargo

Cargo which is received or delivered by direct delivery at the ship's hook will be charged porterage rates of fifty percent of the rates quoted in item 8.

11. Terminal Handling Charge (containerised cargo)

The following charges apply to the handling of containers and container cargo on the quay and include the following—

# 12. Aid and Charitable Organisations

Cargo imported by aid or charitable organisations recognised as such by the Government of Sierra Leone will be granted 50% reduction on port cargo handling rates.

## 13. Logs for export

Logs which are brought into the port, using contractor's own equipment and labour and stored in leased areas, will not attract port cargo handling charges or rentals.

Logs which are transported from leased stacking areas to the ship's side using the Authority's labour and equipment will be charged Le. 3,000 per m<sup>3</sup>.

#### FOURTH SCHEDULE

# PORT ADDITIONAL SERVICES (REGULATION 10)

#### 1. Currency for Ports Additional Charges

The currency for the payment of port's additional charges is the Leone except for those charges which are quoted in USS and are normally to be paid by the ship or her agent

#### 2. Normal working rates and Overtime charges

The rates for equipment and staff in this Schedule are calculated for normal working during the regular working hours of the Authority, which are from 0800 to 1700. Mondays to Fridays.

#### 3. Storage of goods and Containers

The Authority accepts goods and containers into the port for temporary storage and onward shipment on the clear understanding that the Authority accepts no hability or responsibility whatsoever for the condition or quality of the goods or packaging on arrival or for any damage, or loss, alleged to have occured while the goods or containers are stored in the port.

### 4. Free time for storage

The Authority will grant free storage time of ten days for all goods, vehicles and containers, after which time, rental charges will accrue.

The commencement of the storage time is 2400 hours on the day that the goods or containers arrive in the port, for export cargo, and 2400 hours on the day of departure of the importing ship in the case of import cargoes or containers.

Note:—Free time and days for calculation of rental are calendar days and include all weekends and public holidays.

# Rental Charges for storage (Imports and Exports)

The following rental charges will be raised on all goods, vehicles and containers which remain in the port beyond the expiry of the ten days of free storage time.

#### 7. Rebate of storage charges for containers used by the port

Where any container or unit of equipment, while stored in the port, is used by the port for any purpose, the storage rental charge for the period of such use will be waived.

## 8. Hire of Authority 's equipment and staff

The Authority may on request, hire equipment, drivers and staff at the following rates:—

In all cases, the equipment is only to be handled by Authority's staff and must remain within the Authority's boundaries. The hire charge quoted below includes the hire or employment of the drivers and staff considered necessary by the Authority.

# 9. Hire of Equipment to proceed outside Port boundaries

In all cases any equipment hired should be used within the port perimeter. Should a hirer wish to use the equipment at an external location, the approval of Port Management, in writing, must be obtained.

The charges to be levied in such cases will be negotiated separately but in any case will not be less than 50% of the individual rates quoted in item 8.

# 10. Leasing of Port Sheds or open storage areas

Where an individual or company wishes to lease a cargo shed or open storage area and reserve that space for his own unrestricted use, charges will be raised in leones on the basis of a negotiated rate per square meter per month.

Note:—Cargo stored in a leased shed or storage area will not be liable to the Authority's free time or rental charges.

# 11. Hire of Port Security or Gangway Guards

The standard marine charge in item 8 includes the provision of the Authority's Security and Gangway Guards for ships calling at Freetown

Port. In the case of a special request for the services of additional security forces, or guards, whether on board a ship, or not, a charge will be made on the basis of a man/hour.

For the hire of additional security ... 'U\$.\$5.00 perman/hour

This charge will be effective for all periods, day, night, weekends and helidays.\*

#### 12. Waste disposal and garbage collection

The Authority operates a waste disposal and collection unit and ship operators are reminded that the disposal of any waste material into the harbour is strictly prohibited. Any vessel found dumping solid or liquid waste will be liable to a fine and the imposition of charges for cleaning up processes.

For the disposal of sweepings and other shipborne waste, owners, operators and agents are reminded that no materials, sweepings or residues of any sort; may leave the port premises without a signed release from either the agent or the ship operator.

For the disposal of such waste materials a special rate will be quoted on request.

The port is not equipped for the reception of oily waste, but in case the receiver of such waste provides his own equipment a rate of US\$15.00 will be charged per metric tonne.

## 13. Supply of Fresh Water to ships

Supply of fresh water over the quay ... US\$8.00 per metric tonne

# 14. Supply of Bunker Fuels at the Queen Elizabeth II Quay

The charge will be made to ships agents, or owners, for the use of the Queen Elizabeth II quay for the transfer of fuel oils and bunkers either in bulk from a road tanker or in barrels.

Stand by and Security charges for bunkering \$3.00 per tonne.

# 15. Supply of Electrical power

Where the Authority is requested to provide electrical power for any reason a charge will be raised which will relate to the amount of cable required, the duration of the service and the amount of electrical power consumed.

The Authority will not be liable for any loss or damage caused by disruption of supply.

Reefer container connected to the port's electrical power system will be charged Le 20,000.00 per 24 hour per TEU.

# 16. Underwater Services

For the service of divers, diving crew, equipment and launch a minimum charge of two hours will be levied—

For diving services inside harbour ... \$400.00 per hour

For diving services outside harbour \_\_\_\_\_\_ S600.00 per hour

The Authority may reject any request for underwater services or, impose such additional charges for special insurance and conditions as are seen to be necessary.

Note:—Except with the written permission of the Port Management no vessel, or, agents may employ or use any other divers in the Port of Freetown than the Authority's official diving teams.

# 17. Auction Sales of uncleared and abandoned cargo

Goods which have been landed in the port as imports or overlanded cargo, or which have entered the port intended for export and have not been cleared after thirty days, may be declared to be abandoned cargo and may be sold by the Authority at a public auction.

In any such case notice will be given by the Sierra Leone Customs, either in the official Gazette or in writing, of the description of the

goods and the intention to sell them by public auction failing the immediate removal of the goods and the payment of all charges due.

Subsequent to such notification and the lapse of a further thirty days, the Authority may collect all such goods at a convenient place and conduct a public auction to dispose of the goods.

Revenues raised as a result of the auction, or disposal by other means, shall be payable to the Authority and shall be used to defray expenses properly made for handling and storage, as applicable.

Any sums remaining, after deduction of charges and expenses, shall be held on account for the owner of the goods.

Any such sums which are not claimed within one year of the date of the auction or disposal shall revert to the Authority in full.
